Today in the fellowship hall join us as we continue our sermon series, 24 Hours That Changed the World, based on the last day of Jesus' earthly life. Our sermon this morning is Condemned by the Righteous.

Mark 14:53-55, 61-72 from the Common English Bible (CEB):

⁵³ They led Jesus away to the high priest, and all the chief priests, elders, and legal experts gathered. ⁵⁴ Peter followed him from a distance, right into the high priest's courtyard. He was sitting with the guards, warming himself by the fire. ⁵⁵The chief priests and the whole Sanhedrin were looking for testimony against Jesus in order to put him to death, but they couldn't find any.

⁶¹ But Jesus was silent and didn't answer. Again, the high priest asked, "Are you the Christ, the Son of the blessed one?" ⁶²Jesus said, "I am. And you will see the Human One sitting on the right side of the Almighty and coming on the heavenly clouds." 63 Then the high priest tore his clothes and said, "Why do we need any more witnesses? 64 You've heard his insult against God. What do you think?" They all condemned him. "He deserves to die!" 65 Some began to spit on him. Some covered his face and hit him, saying, "Prophesy!" Then the guards took him and beat him.

 66 Meanwhile, Peter was below in the courtyard. A woman, one of the high priest's servants, approached 67 and saw Peter warming himself by the fire. She stared at him and said, "You were also with the Nazarene, Jesus." 68 But he denied it, saying, "I don't know what you're talking about. I don't understand what you're saying." And he went outside into the outer courtyard. A rooster crowed. ⁶⁹ The female servant saw him and began a second time to say to those standing around, "This man is one of them." ⁷⁰ But he denied it again. A short time later, those standing around again said to Peter, "You must be one of them, because you are also a Galilean." ⁷¹ But he cursed and swore, "I don't know this man you're talking about." ⁷² At that very moment, a rooster crowed a second time. Peter remembered what Jesus told him, "Before a rooster crows twice, you will deny me three times." And he broke down, sobbing.
